

# Postural Support Devices Collection by DDO

The DDO PSD Collection can be retro-fitted to any appropriate wheelchair converting it into a postural support wheelchair. The DDO PSD collection uses PSDs that were awarded in USAID Design Challenge conducted in Jhpiego, affiliate of Johns Hopkins University. DDO PSD Collection is recommended for established services that need sets of PSDs which allow them the freedom to create solutions that are as basic or as complex as required by trained professionals. It is modular and versatile; it can be mounted on any locally made solid seat and back panels and contains a set of interchangeable postural supports.

It boasts high quality while being the lowest cost option on the market. Its adjustability and universality make it unique. The PSDs can be mixed, adjusted and replaced as the child grows until it is reasonably feasible. The DDO PSD Collection is compliant with WHO Guidelines and Training.

The DDO PSD Collection weight is between 6.9kg to 7.9kg depending on the size. Maximum user weight capacity ranges from 50kg to 100kg. Adjustability – All components are adjustable.
